New Rates Help Cover Increases in Operating Costs and Future Master Plan Projects

The Canby Utility Board has implemented a water rate adjustment effective August 1, 2016. The adjustment increases overall water rate revenues approximately 9.53

percent and provides necessary funding for increases in general operating expenses including costs of labor and water line repair materials.

Additional revenue generated will also provide funding of identified future water master plan projects that will be constructed when expected growth dictates. These future master plan projects include construction of a new water treatment plant that will produce drinking water from the Willamette River.

Customer Water Filter Promotion

Canby Utility has introduced a new program to provide rebates to residential and commercial customers who purchase home water filtration systems. The program provides a post-purchase rebate of \$25 for residential customers and \$200 rebate for commercial customers who serve Canby Utility drinking water as a part of a commercial food service operation such as a restaurant, cafeteria, deli or beverage establishment. Call us to see if your business qualifies for a rebate.

Many Americans drink bottled water for reasons of convenience or preferred taste. It's estimated that over 80% of all single-use water bottles used in the U.S. become litter that takes hundreds of years to naturally break down. Compared to filtered home tap water, bottled water is expensive! Some major bottling companies use filtered municipal supply water, so essentially, by using a water filter at your home, you will have similar qualities to bottled water.

Residential customers who present a receipt proving purchase of any home filtration system or replacement filter cartridges for such system will qualify for a one-time \$25 rebate in the form of an account credit. Customers who do not receive a monthly water bill because they reside in a rental unit of a large multi-family residential facility that is single-metered for water service are also eligible for the one-time \$25 bill credit.

Commercial customers may receive a one-time \$200 rebate upon submission of proof of purchase of a commercial-grade filtration system or filter media replacement expense for maintenance of an existing commercial filtration system.

Purchases of bottled water will not qualify for a rebate.



Fact or Fiction?

FICTION: When I'm not home, keeping my air conditioner at a lower temperature throughout the day means it doesn't have to run harder to cool my home when I return.

FACT: To save energy, set your thermostat to a higher temperature during the day when no one is home, and lower it when you return.

FACT: Closing vents can cause the compressor to cycle too frequently and the heat pump to overload. You'll also use more energy.

FICTION: Bigger is better when it comes to cooling equipment.

FACT: Too often, cooling equipment isn't sized properly and leads to higher electric bills. A unit that is too large for your home will not cool evenly and might produce higher humidity indoors.
